THE SOUTH AFRICAN STATISTICS COUNCIL

In terms of the Statistics Act (Act no.6 of 1999) the South African Statistics Council has been established. The Council consists of 25 members appointed by the Minister, from nominations obtained through public invitations and a request to the executive council of each province. The Statistician-General is by virtue of his office (after consultation with the Cabinet), a member of Council and may attend meetings of the Council.

The members of the Council possess relevant professional proficiency and interest and are broadly representatives of groups or interests concerned with the production and use of official statistics. They hold office for a period not exceeding 3 years and will advise the Minister, the Statistician-General or an organ of state that produces statistics with regard to-

- Matters referred to the Council by the Minister, the Statistician-General or the organ of the state;
- Any matter regarding the collection, processing, analysis, documentation, storage and dissemination of statistics, including the taking of a population census, which should, in the opinion of the Council, be studied or undertaken;
- The elimination of unnecessary overlapping or duplication with regard to the collection or publication of statistics by organs of state; and
- any matter considered relevant or expedient by the Council for the effective carrying out of the above-mentioned Act

The Council will meet at least twice a year and members not in full-time employment of the state will be reimbursed for travel costs and given a token honorarium.

Activities of the Statistics Council from January- April 2001

Since its inception the new SA Statistics Council is playing a meaningful and active role in statistical matters. The Statistics Council has had 3 meetings which involved in depth discussions and making recommendations on the following:

A. The Population Census 2001 Questionnaire

B. Survey of Total Earnings and Employment (STEE)

Apart from the above-mentioned documents there are also 2 documents ("**Proposed frameworks for National Statistics System' and ''Review of structure for Stats SA'**) tabled by Stats SA at the Council meeting of 24 January 01(to be precise) which the Council is currently looking at.

Some Council members (Dr Southall, Prof Simkins, Prof Galpin, Mr Prinsloo and Mr. Patel) had a meeting with Stats SA staff on the 28 March for final discussion on the questionnaire and to ensure that the Council's recommendations have been considered.
